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Needy Meds – Needy Meds is a 501 C non-profit organization with the mission of helping people who can't afford to pay for their medications. They will assist with the cost of prescriptions, co-pays, premiums and disease related expenses. Needy Meds has information on more than 2,400 programs that are available at no cost, requires no registration and is always up-to-date. There is also a database of clinics that offer healthcare at no cost, for a small fee, or on a sliding scale basis. The free Needy Meds Drug Discount card can save you up to 75% on prescriptions, requires no financial, age or residency restrictions, **but cannot be used with insurance**. Download, print, clip and save your card at www.needy meds.org.

RxAssist is a website with information, news and a database that are all designed to help you find out about ways to get affordable, or free, medications. The database includes information on the pharmaceutical companies' patient assistance programs, or programs that provide free or low cost medication to low-income patients. RxAssist was created by Volunteers in Health Care, a national nonprofit resource center for health care programs working with the uninsured. Prescriptions in England – Patients can apply for five-year exemption certificates entitling them to all of their NHS prescriptions free of charge, not just those for cancer. Application forms can be collected from GP surgeries and hospital clinics. Applications received by March 24 will be processed in time for the start of the program on April 1. Dream Come True of the Lehigh Valley, PA.

Dream Come True of the Lehigh Valley was founded in 1984 by local businessman Kostas Kalogeropoulos. Kostas was sitting in the lounge of the hotel he owns in Allentown PA when he overheard a conversation regarding a young child who had aggressive cancer. Her family wanted to take her to Disney world before anything happened to her but could not afford it. That night Kostas couldn't sleep knowing there was a child who could not realize her dream. The next day he found a way to contact the family and out of his own pocket gave her a Disney world trip. Afterwards he thought if there is one child there must be many more who are sick and want a dream. He held a press conference asking for money, volunteers and children. That first year we fulfilled 2 dreams and 25 years later Dream Come True has fulfilled 1,000 dreams for kids who are seriously, chronically or terminally ill. In 1993 we added a part time employee, Executive Director Rayann Vasko, who had been a volunteer for many years.

Dreams range from the most common, Disneyworld, to many unique ones. One young boy was GI Joe for the day and was made a five star general. Another boy's dream was to visit Dinosaur Land in Utah. Unique dreams included spending the day with Broadway star Helen Hayes and Eartha Kitt, meeting Princess Diana, riding in a Russian fighter jet, meeting Duke University Basketball Coach Krzyzewski. Many children dream of swimming pools, redecorated bedrooms, computers and more. We are not government funded and rely on private donations.

We offer our Dream Come True children various activities throughout the year. We host a picnic and holiday party. We also host a "North Pole Express" where we fly some of our kids on an airplane to the "North Pole". Once they land at the "North Pole" the children spend the day with Santa and Mrs. Claus.

In 2002 Dream Come True expanded our services to include helping any child who had a dream from us with college. Each Dream Come True child is eligible for an annual scholarship. We also help families with funeral expenses should a child unfortunately pass away.

We partner with other organizations such as The Leukemia Lymphoma Society, American Cancer Society, Specialty Care Clinic, Pediatric Cancer Support Group, The Wellness Community, Camelot for Children, Angel34 to offer our children and families many more much needed services.
